World Day of the Poor is on Sunday, Nov. 19. The theme is "Let us love, not with words but with deeds." Pope Francis calls on us to pray and care for creation and for the poor. The prayer that should be at the heart of all our actions is "The Our Father" which is the prayer of the poor because in it we ask God for "our daily bread" for our most basic needs. We are asked to practise the corporal works of mercy and make them part of our life's routine. One of the things that we can do is to support our church's outreach to the poor by contributing to the food bank. The 19th lands on the 3rd weekend of the month when we are reminded to bring items for the food box. Let's be extra generous this month and fill it to over-flowing - overflowing with our expression of caring for those in need! We are also challenged to think ahead and plan what other acts of mercy we will do in answer to the call to serve the poor.

## Food for Your Journey - World Day of the Poor

"Let us love, not with words but with deeds."

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis has declared the first World Day of the Poor for Sunday, November 19, 2017, the 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time.

The Holy Father writes: "I invite the whole Church, and men and women of good will everywhere, to turn their gaze on this day to all those who stretch out their hands and plead for our help and solidarity. They are our brothers and sister, created and loved by the one Heavenly Father.

This Day is meant, above all, to encourage believers to react against a culture of discard and waste, and to embrace the culture of encounter. At the same time, everyone, independent of religious affiliation, is invited to openness and sharing with the poor through concrete signs of solidarity and fraternity. God created the heavens and the earth for all; yet sadly some have erected barriers, walls and fences, betraying the original gift meant for all humanity, with none excluded."

"It is my wish that, in the week preceding the World Day of the Poor, Christian communities will make every effort to create moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance for the poor."

"This new World Day, therefore, should become a powerful appeal to our consciences as believers, allowing us to grow in the conviction that sharing with the poor enables us to understand the deepest truth of the Gospel. The poor are not a problem: they are a resource from which to draw as we strive to accept and practice in our live the essence of the Gospel."
