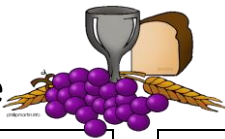

On September 12 & 13 all the Youth Groups will be making salsa. They need donations of apples and tomatoes. Clean 250ml and 500ml jars are also welcome.

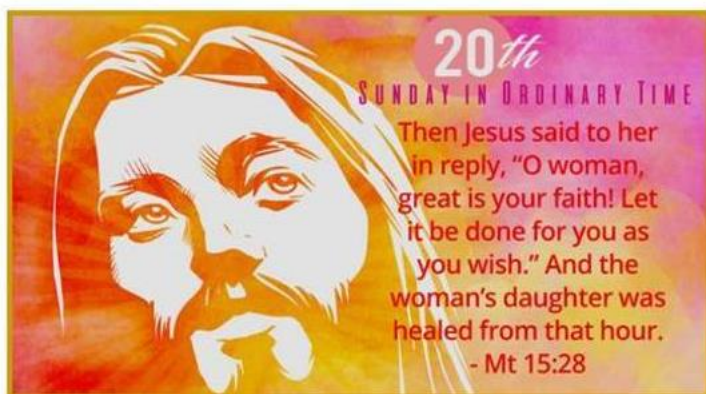


DISCOVERY BIBLE CAMP - LOST & FOUND
