## Food for Your Journey - Death

A famous Anglican bishop tells this story on himself.

When I was told that I had six months to live, the first reaction was naturally shock...but I also felt liberated: for now I clearly saw the target I was aiming at. But my second reaction was: "Gosh, six months is a long time. One can do a lot in that time. How am I going to use it?"

The first reaction is to give up things; one sifts out the non-essentials. But I soon realized that I was not to prepare for death, but in a truly Christian way, prepare for "eternal life," which means real living.

This Christian attitude means that I am more concerned about the quality of life than its quantity. How long it goes on is purely secondary.

So, preparing for eternity means: learning really It means becoming more concerned with contributing to and enjoying what matters most. It means giving to life, and getting the most from it - while it is still there.
