Bill C-418 to amend the criminal code to protect the conscience rights of medical staff in regards to assisted death - a reply has been received from MP Don Rusnak which said, "The bill deserves careful thought" but also spoke about the importance of protecting the rights of individuals who are seeking assisted death. He said, "Should a doctor opposed to this procedure be required to refer them to doctor that is not?" This remark may suggest that he is not on board with the bill. If you haven't contacted him yet, write soon and let him know that other provinces have found a way to protect both rights. The amendment would force all provinces to do so.
