Congratulations to Bridgid Lockhart, who had her daughter, Rayna Grace Destiny, baptized on June 22nd.

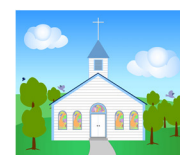


KITCHEN HELP NEEDED!

Be nice to ordinary people. You're still one of them.

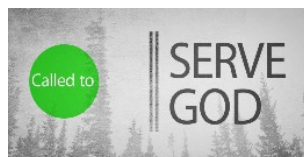
No one sells a car because it runs too well.
