**Proposed changes to the Assisted Dying law:** Quebec Judge, Christine Baudouin, ruled that the legal requirement that only people whose natural death was imminent would be eligible for assisted death was unduly restrictive and discriminatory. The Federal Government has long argued that the "reasonably foreseeable" clause was necessary to protect vulnerable people, such as those with physical, psychiatric and developmental disabilities; however, prior to the Federal election, Prime Minister Trudeau said that a re-elected Liberal government would expand the legislation to bring the law into line with the court ruling. The ruling gave the federal government six months to pass new legislation. The federal government is asking for an extension on the court deadline. The bill has been tabled for February. It launched a two-week consultation period last month that saw over 300,000 submissions. Thank you to those who participated in January. Let us continue our efforts to protect the vulnerable by contacting our MP (Marcus.Powlowski@parl.gc.ca) to let him know that we want the present safeguards to remain in place.

This particular seminarian had had military training, and was able to surprise his captor and disarm hing. Now the table was turned: it was the Druze who was ordered down the path.


As they walked along, however, the seminarian recalled the words of Jesus, "Love your enemy. Do good to those that hate you."
