

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Saint Anthony of Padua - June 13

There are more than 10,000 saints recognized by the Roman Catholic Church. I consider Saint Anthony of Padua as the superstar of all the saints.

Saint Anthony of Padua was a Catholic Priest from Portugal, who lived and worked as a friar of the Franciscan Order. Born into an esteemed family in Lisbon, Portugal, he attended a local cathedral school. At the age of 15, he joined an Augustinian community.

He was later sent to Coimbra, where he spent 9 years studying the Augustinian theology intensely. Sometime around these years, while he was in his early 20s, he was ordained as a priest. The return of the dead bodies of a few Franciscan friars from Morocco turned out to be the turning point of his life.

At that point, he decided that he would be a Franciscan friar. He later combined his Augustine faith with Franciscan ideologies. He made it his mission to preach among the Muslims in the Middle East and fully accepted the chances of martyrdom.

Over the years, he traveled around the world, gaining a reputation as a miracle worker and a great preacher. He was later made the patron saint of lost things and a 'Doctor of the Church.'

He is also the patron saint of lost people, lost souls, amputees, animals, barrenness, elderly people, faith in the Blessed Sacrament, fishermen, oppressed people, poor people, pregnant women, shipwrecks, starvation, sterility and travelers. Very many countries and churches have Saint Anthony their patron.

The Church, while noting in the prayer of his feast Anthony's effectiveness as an intercessor, wants us to learn from Anthony, the teacher, the meaning of true wisdom and what it means to become like Jesus, who humbled and emptied himself for our sakes and went about doing good.

St. Anthony of Padua's life is what every Christian's life is meant to be; a steady courage to face the ups and downs of life, the call to love and forgive, to be concerned for the needs of others, to deal with crisis great and small, and to have our feet solidly

on the ground of total trusting love and dependence on God.

As we grapple with the grave effects of the pandemic, we may learn a lot from the life of this simple and humble preacher who is undoubtedly one of the greatest miracle workers in our catholic church. May Saint Anthony of Padua intercede for all of us and find out the normality which we have lost due to these trying times.

SUMMARY OF ROADMAP TO REOPENING ONTARIO

Step 1 – June 14th

(60% of adults vaccinated with one dose) Outdoor religious services, rites and ceremonies with capacity limited to permit physical distancing. Step 2 – July 7

(70% of adults vaccinated with one dose and 20% vaccinated with two doses)

Indoor religious services, rites and ceremonies at 15% capacity.

Step 3 – August 1

(70 to 80% of adults vaccinated with one dose and 25% vaccinated with two doses)

Indoor and outdoor religious services, rites and ceremony gatherings with capacity limited to permit physical distancing of 2 metres.

At the end of the 21 days, the province will evaluate vaccination rates and look for positive trends in other key public health and health system indicators.
