Our Lady of the Rosary

Our Rosary is like a garland offered to Mary because we pray a prayer on each bead. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, formerly known as Our Lady of Victory and Feast of the Holy Rosary, is celebrated on 7 October.

Saint Dominic received a vision of the Blessed Virgin, who gave him the rosary as a tool against heretics. The development of Rosary owes much to the followers of St. Dominic, including the 15thcentury priest and teacher, Alanus de Rupe.

Pius V instituted the feast of Our Lady of Victory to commemorate the victory at Lepanto, which he attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary. In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the name of the feast to Feast of the Holy Rosary, to be celebrated on the first Sunday of October. Pius XII called it a compendium of the gospel.

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.

I most sincerely thank all our parishioners who recite the holy Rosary after the weekday masses offering every decade for the intention of the faithful from not only our parish but also from all over the world.

If you practice no other devotion in the spiritual life, pray the rosary. Through it, you will obtain all that you need and will vanguish the enemies of your soul. Through it, you will find peace and joy in the trials of life. Conquer the devil-pray the rosary!

May God bless us through the intercessions of our Saint Mary.
