FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Baptism: Belonging To The Catholic Church

The Christmas season comes to an end with the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. The baptism of Jesus reminds us of our identity. By Baptism we become sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of His Church, heirs of Heaven, and temples of the Holy Spirit.

Every validly baptized person belongs to the Catholic Church no matter how unaware the person may be of belonging to the Mystical Body of Christ. To be an actual member of the Catholic Church, the baptized person must also be ready to profess what the Catholic Church teaches, and accept her laws and obligations with an open heart.

It's unfortunate that many baptized Catholics have started to critically and cynically look down on our Catholic church. The right attitude might be to have a strong sense of belonging and take responsibility to change it. Grace Lee Boggs reminds us that you cannot change any society unless you take responsibility for it, unless you see yourself as belonging to it, and responsible for changing it.

Let's belong, participate and change the church as a better place for everyone to experience the presence of God. **The ongoing Synod** is a perfect opportunity to do this.

As William Arthur Ward would say "Do more than belong: participate. Do more than care: help. Do more than believe: practice".

Important Update on Covid-19 Covid-Omicron Update - January 4, 2022

The Ontario Government has implemented new directives due to the Covid-Omicron variant spread. These directives begin on Wednesday January 5 and run for 21 days. These new updates do not change our present status in churches. We are still at 50% capacity (every second pew) with social distancing required. Family units can sit together. Masks must be worn and hand sanitizing is recommended. Holy Communion is to be distributed in the hand and there is no congregational singing at this time. Parish meetings, if necessary, are limited to 5 persons, and funeral services are maintained following the BAO directives. We recommend that parish offices be 'closed to the public' at this time, but this is at the discretion of the pastor. Secretaries and bookkeepers can still be working and social distancing and masking are required.

If you are still uncomfortable about attending Mass in person please check for on-line celebrations. You are encouraged to get your vaccination and booster when you can for your safety and the safety of your family and those around you. Let us continue to work together creating a safe environment for our parishioners and their families as we pray for an end to this pandemic.
