Advent is...A Wreath of Evergreens and Light!

As Christians, we use symbols to express our faith. Symbols have enhanced meaning when associated with particular seasons. One such symbol is the Advent wreath.

As early as the Middle Ages, Christians used fire and light to represent Christ's coming into the world. Using this same symbolism, the Advent wreath developed a few centuries ago in Germany as a sign of the waiting and hopeful expectation of the return in glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The round wreath, without beginning or end, reminds us of eternity. The green colour stands for life and growth. The four candles represent the ages "sitting in darkness and the shadow of death," each candle adding more light as we get closer to Christmas.

The lighting of candles banishes the darkness as a reminder of Jesus Christ, the Light who has come into the world through His birth, and who continues to shine brightly through His Church.

The Advent wreath reminds us to shine the light of Christ in this world. As Jesus tells us, You are the light of the world ... let Your light shine before others (Matthew 5:14-16).
