PALM SUNDAY HOSANNA IN THE HIGHEST

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Palm Sunday, the final Sunday of Lent, marks the beginning of the 'Holy Week', in which we celebrate the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. The liturgy of Palm Sunday has two emphases: the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, and the Passion as a whole. Hence, Passion Sunday.

Prior to Vatican II, Passion Sunday was the 5th Sunday of Lent and Palm Sunday was observed on the subsequent Sunday. After Vatican II, the Church decided to combine the two Sundays. This puts a greater emphasis on Palm Sunday and also reinforces the Passion narrative that is proclaimed on that day.

Riding a donkey from the Mount of Olives to the acclaim of the crowds with palm branches, Jesus fulfilled messianic prophecies. The palm branch is a symbol of victory, triumph, peace and eternal life. The donkey represents the humble arrival of someone in peace.

Palm Sunday is a reminder of the welcoming of Jesus into our hearts and of our willingness to follow him. The Passion Sunday reminds us that we follow the crucified Messiah, the one who gained victory precisely in defeat.



So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out,

"HOSANNA!

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" John 12:13


