For centuries, the Russians told a legend about a young prince called Alexis. He lived in a gigantic ornate palace, while all around him lived hundreds of poor peasants in filthy hovels. The prince was mover to better their lot. So he began to visit them. But he could not make any real contact with them. They always treated him with high respect, and felt ill-at-ease with him. Then he though things over and one day came out to the people dressed as a rough and ready young doctor who wanted to devote his life to the poor. He strated by renting a rat-ridden shack on a back street. He wore old torn clothes, just like the people. He lived on the plainest food. Often he did not know where hes next meal would come from. He made no money because he treated everyone free and gave away his Before long, he won the love and medicines. respect of all the people. As Prince Alexis, he had never succeeded in doing that. Little by little, he transformed the whole spirit of the place: settling quarrels, reconciling enemies, helping people to live decent lives. No one guessed that this young doctor was in fact the Prince himself, who had abandoned his palace and gone down among his people to become one of them. That is a parallel to the story of Christ and Christmas Day.
