Did you know? Some say it is unfair for only Catholics to have publically funded schools. Historically Ontario’s Catholic Education system was established to address the needs of Catholic families, who were a religious minority in the province. In 1867 the British North American Act guaranteed that all educational right held by minorities would be protected.

Did you know? Catholic schools have maintained and enhanced their foundational place in Ontario's public education system as it has evolved. It would be unfair to the Catholic community and the people of Ontario, to dismantle a school system that has been an integral part of publicly funded education since 1841. It would also be a dangerous precedent for minority rights in Canada.
