Food for your Journey – Judge Not

I was walking through the German woods with a local farmer. We came upon the ruins of a little chapel. “A relic of wartime bombing?” I asked.

“No,” he answered; “a relic of God’s punishment.”

“What do you mean?”

“I’ll tell you.....”

“A few years before the war, seven men from my village were returning late at night from a get-together in the nearby town. They got caught in a violent thunderstorm and had no choice but to take shelter in this little chapel. Water trickled through the leaking roof. Bolts of lightning kept striking closer and closer. They were scared to death and the tension rose so high that one of the men screamed, ‘One of us must be drawing down that lightning as a punishment.’

“In order to find out who it was, they stood their walking sticks in the soft mud outside. Whoever’s stick fell over with the next rumble of thunder, was guilty. Flash! Crash! sizzled the lightning, so close they could smell it. They all ran out to look and, surely enough, one stick was down. It belonged to Hans Moser. They rushed back inside and left him standing outside. He pleaded and cried and begged, but they would not let him in. In despair, he ran off home in the pummelling rain.

“The next day when the other six failed to appear, the whole village went out to look for them. They were found in the chapel, burned beyond recognition. They and it had been struck by lightning.

“The charred ruins of that chapel are still their memorial today and a grim reminder that we should not judge ourselves to be without fault and shove our brother out into the darkness. God might have the opposite opinion.”
